Bob Fougere

It saddens us to announce the passing of a very active member of the club: Bob Fougere.

Bob was born in Plymouth, Michigan on October 31st, 1950. He attended Farmington High School and lived in the area for most of his life, save for a few years, when his father decided to move the family back to his native Nova Scotia. Bob missed Michigan and soon returned to Farmington, spending most his working life in sales, largely in the food industry.

After a chance meeting with a club member, Bob decided he wanted an MGB, acquiring his 1977 Harvest Gold model in the summer of 2003 and joining the Windsor-Detroit MG Club soon afterwards. The following year he could be found at almost every meeting and event, with the result that he won the *Rookie of the Year* award for 2004.

About 3-years ago, Bob was diagnosed with bladder cancer. The surgical options offered were unacceptable to him and he opted for a holistic healing approach, with which he credited his relative wellness until the spring of this year, when he took a turn for the worse and entered hospital. He was given just a few weeks to live but continued to surpass the doctors' predictions, eventually losing his battle on November 4th, a few days after his 67th birthday, at the Angela Hospice in Livonia.

A number of club members attended his Memorial Service at the Hospice on November 10th and were able, on behalf of the club, to pass on our condolences to his brother Michael and his sister Lucille, who had flown in from Saskatchewan and Nova Scotia respectively.

We will miss his familiar presence at our future events and meetings.

Visit to the Parade Company

Many thanks to Adam Guca, Vice-President of the Jaguar Affiliates Group of Michigan (JAGM) club and member of WDMGC, for organizing a truly fun and interesting tour of the Parade Company in Detroit followed by lunch at the very first Buddy's Pizza restaurant.

The Michigan Thanksgiving Parade, now known as America's Thanksgiving Parade® presented by Art Van, was founded in 1924. For more than 90 years (some years were missed during WW2), the Parade has been a one-of-a-kind spectacle of fantasy, holiday spirit and community enthusiasm. The Parade Company is a non-profit organization and relies for funding on donations from local companies and individuals. It is best known for the floats and balloons it builds from the initial artwork sketches to fantastic displays we see on Woodward Avenue each US Thanksgiving Day.



Adam is seen here standing by some of the Styrofoam blocks that are glued together and then carved with band-saws and hot-wires by artists who transform the 2 sketches, produced in cooperation with the sponsors, into 3D models.

Special zero solvent paint that will not dissolve the Styrofoam is then applied by more skilled artisans.

A single float may require hundreds of individually made pieces along with other structures made from paper-maché covered chicken wire, welded steel and wood.

Some of the floats are self-propelled with the driver unable to see and having to rely on a small monitor screen and spotters who walk beside the float and who are in touch with the driver by radio.

There are overhead obstacles, such as the People Mover, on Woodward that can present a challenge to high structures such as this lighthouse, in front of which Anne Astley is standing, which has to be articulated so that it can be lowered as it passes under the doors of the Parade Company and obstructions on the parade route. Similarly, very tall balloons have to be pulled down by their handlers to pass under anything that is too low and that might damage them.

You may notice that Steve and Ruth Swarin, like the other club members pictured here, still wear their outdoor jackets. Money is always tight at the Parade Company and so they seldom heat or cool it, which must make it very difficult for those who create these works of art. The temperatures were close to freezing when we visited but on a hot summer's day, our guide informed us, it can be above 100°F inside.



If you want to be in the parade and help the cash-strapped Parade Company, for \$200 you can choose from hundreds of different "big-heads" to wear. Which of these two would you think would suit Mary-ellen Weakley best?




