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


The Patzwald Garage By Robert Patzwald

Marsha and I have been married and lived in the same house for 41 years. We love our home and are constantly upgrading as the budget permits. The one area that has always been lacking was a large garage. The house has an attached one car 26' x 12' basement garage with a concrete deck. We have never used it for driver car storage as it was always occupied by bicycles, tools and lawnmowers. A large outdoor shed moved things out but the garage was quickly filled with two motorcycles, air compressor, welders, table saw and of course the MGB.

Last fall, we decided to get serious about a larger garage. Driveway work just isn't much fun anymore and the constant shuffle of things in and out is a pain. Site selection was the first issue. Several years ago, we purchased a vacant lot next to the existing garage and I had always thought that would be the site of a new garage to supplement the existing one.

I had also considered our back yard with alley access, but hated to lose the green space. Marsha and I weighed the options. I wanted a garage at least 12' in eave height to allow for a lift and that height would block the view from the patio which is over our existing garage. Then there was this thing called old age. The basement garage would require hauling everything from the car up a flight of stairs through the existing garage and woodworking shop to the living level. The backyard option reduces the distance to 10' to the back door and three steps into the house. The more we weighed the options, it was clear that the green space had to go.

The next problem was size. Living in an older neighborhood our house is already out of setback compliance on our side (corner lot) by 10'. Moving to the backyard would allow a larger garage. It would really be nice if the garage could be pushed just an additional 3' to avoid many existing improvements in the backyard. There is a provision within the Development Regulations that allows for exemptions based upon the alignment of other structures in the area. It was worth a shot, so I contacted City Hall and started the paperwork.

City Hall is not fast, but that is okay. The final decision was "Yes" and we could actual go out to 7'. We decided 4' was sufficient. That alignment will allow a 35' deep by 24' wide structure with a 14' driveway to the alley. Two garage doors, 10' x10', will face the alley to eliminate backing onto a collector street.

As a sidebar, Marsha was curious what this was going to look like. I decided to learn a bit about Sketch Up. Once fairly proficient at AutoCAD, I figure I could learn a new program. The learning curve wasn't too bad, but once I produced an adequate drawing to satisfy the project director, I have lost interest.

Now we knew where, so the next question what the type of building. We considered stick build, pole barn and metal building. My preliminary budget for the complete building to include concrete was \$25,000, but that was before I enlarged the size of the building. After lots of research and finding how hard it is to find a contractor, we went with an enclosed carport-type building with a proper snow load and wind rating. The building will be engineer certified and we upgraded to the heavier tubing and sheet metal. The project was back in budget.

The next step was concrete. The City may have waived the requirement for footings, but after working in the Public Works Engineering Office for many years, I knew the right answer. Frost footings, grading, and reinforced concrete slab. I wanted to go with a 6" slab, but costs steered us back to go with 4" with steel reinforcement. The process of getting bids was very slow. I waited on contractors for 30 days only to have everyone show up the same week. The lowest bidding contractor said he had a window, but needed to move right away. Oh boy, now we are really spending money. We did the deal and he was there the following Monday to start work. The process only took about a week and a slab and driveway were in place. The first \$10,000+ of the \$25,000 has been expended.

Winter caught up with us, so my dream of having a garage in place by Christmas did not come true. The weather has not allowed the crews to work, but we are hoping for early February. Part II will outline the building construction and all of the upcoming issues related to wiring, heat, and other issues.





MIDGET MUMBLINGS

Pretty sure I have written before about replacing the stock Lucas alternator with a more modern and likely more reliable unit. It seemed every couple years (more likely every 4 or 5 years) I was having to replace the alternators on my MG Midget and Triumph TR8. And for the 8, it was not cheap, and that alternator or parts to rebuild it were getting scarce. So I found online several people who were saying that an alternator from a GM Saturn would bolt up and that you just needed to find a pulley and a different pigtail. So I went to my favorite junk yard, oh wait, they want to be called automotive recyclers these days. Anyway, after much walking through rows of cars packing my tool box, I found some Saturns and some of them had alternators that looked like they might mount up. So I lay on my back under a greasy car and managed eventually to come away with an alternator. I think it cost me \$25. Then I took it to my local auto parts place and had them test it for me. Of course it worked just fine. They even had the pigtail I needed for under \$10, but not the pulley. Your old pulley won't fit since the shaft diameter is different. The Saturn pigtail lacks one of the wires you will need. Finally, I had to go online and locate a pulley and order it for I think nearly \$20. So all in all, I had a working replacement alternator for \$50, or a bit more plus my time and labor. It did bolt right up and it was simple to modify my wiring to attach it. Unlike some replacements, the red indicator lamp on the dash will still function. And both of mine have been working flawlessly now for a few years. I have one on both of my British cars plus a spare that I pack with me when I travel. Parts you pack along will never be needed, so cheap insurance.

But then the other day, while searching for something else, I ran across a deal on Ebay where for just shy of \$110 I could buy the same setup made from entirely new parts. And it puts out 110 amps as opposed to the standard Lucas models that put out less than half that amount. Of course, if you just ordered one, you would miss out on all the fun of research and hikes in the junk yard and trips to various parts places hunting pulleys. Some might see that as a good thing.

I am not advertising for any alternator seller. There are probably several online suppliers offering this same product. Perhaps your favorite local alternator repair shop would be able to supply one. I understand that several other GM cars built around 1990 used this same alternator and that it is common enough that most parts houses keep one in stock if yours should fail sometime when you were far from home.

One person asked me if I didn't worry about the extra amperage being too much for the old wiring. Well, the only wires that might ever carry that big load are the thick brown ones leading from the alternator to the starter solenoid and from there to the battery. And the alternator only puts out the amount of amps that are being needed for powering the lights and such and charging the battery, so it likely won't ever run at full capacity. I have checked and the wires do not feel even warm to the touch, so I think they are able to handle the load.

A clever concourse judge would of course notice the non-stock alternator. For me, that is of no concern. Or at least, far less of a concern than having the battery go completely dead far from home because a Lucas alternator quit working.

In most applications, the unit drops right in, there could be some minor adjustments for a perfect fit. All Lucas alternators were pretty much the same, at least externally, so it fits MGB, Midget, TR6—TR8, and lots of others.

This is a 110-amp alternator replacement for your older 43-amp unit. It will convert your three- or five-wire connector to a simple two-wire connection (complete wiring instructions included) and will properly keep the charging light in the circuit.


